Charles Simmonds Park renewal

At the league meeting Sept. 1, the Charles Simmonds Park renewal committee outlined the steps they have taken so far in their quest to upgrade the park to a unique space that will complement the other park developments in McKernan and create something that people on both sides of 114 Street can enjoy. The general details of the project have been approved under the City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Park Development Program. A City Project Manager and Landscape Architect will be assigned this fall. They will work with the community park committee to develop a park concept, conduct community consultation, design and eventually build the improvements. Hall rental changes

The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in a loss of approximately 90 per cent of the summer revenue from hall rentals, but users are slowly returning. Regular tenants McKernan Child Care Society and Alberta AdapatAbilities are back, along with a small number of evening users (Ad Astra Rhythmic Gymnastics and Nantanreikan Karate) — all operating under strict hygiene conditions. Regular rental groups including yoga, music and dance will not be back in 2020-2021, but it is hoped the health situation that would allow these groups to return will be clarified by spring/summer. Some community one-time rentals will be allowed, depending on numbers and availability.

Playgroup moves outside

The Monday morning playgroup will be taking to McKernan Park (112 St. and 76 Ave.) on Mondays from 10 - 11.30 a.m. starting Sept. 14. Playgroup for kids ages 0 to 5 is a great way to meet families in the local community and get some fresh air. It will be a fun and safe way to play in the fall. Community art

Be on the lookout for a couple of art projects around the community. The McKernan Rangoli Walk will allow adults and children to colour in the outlines of beautiful butterflies or mandela patterns to brighten the sidewalks of our community. The Rangoli Walk appears at two locations: Alberta Butterflies is located along 78th Avenue leading to

McKernan Hall (east of 114 St.), and McKernan Mandalas is in the Pocket Park along University Avenue and 112 St. This project, managed by Agnieszka Matejko, was featured in the City of Edmonton's Keep Neighbouring newsletter!

Scott MacLean is the league's new treasure. He has lived in McKernan since 2011 with his wife Ariane and three boys. He grew up in Cape Breton and spent 13 years in the Canadian Forces as a medical officer, retiring in 2017. He now works as an ER physician in the Edmonton area.

Rolinda Graham joins as the newest director-at-large. She moved to McKernan with her husband Jim and 2 daughters in 2016. The girls attended McKernan school and are now at Strathcona High School and Harry Ainlay. The Grahams love the walkability of McKernan and the convenience of the nearby LRT.

Reports were also presented on the state of the league's finances. With the hall debt reduced to \$148,438 at the end of 2019 and a healthy surplus, the league moved into the challenging 2020 year in a pretty solid financial position. The hall rental report noted that up until Covid-19 we were steadily building ourselves as a venue of choice with many repeat renters and referrals from satisfied renters.

Also at the AGM, membership costs were voted on as required by the league's bylaws. In recognition of the financial challenges facing many community members — and the low revenue generally acquired by membership fees — members voted to set the fees to zero for 2020-2021. Fees normally range from \$10 to \$35 depending on membership class. See information on page 1!

110 St. residents suggest shared-use street

Residents of 110 St. between 76 Ave and Saskatchewan Drive have been speaking to the City since the fall about the separated bike lane proposed for their street. Installation of this bike lane would necessitate the removal of parking and possibly boulevard trees, along with making the street one-way. These residents are concerned that this presents significant accessibility problems for residents, visitors and home support services.

Residents now are pointing to the success of the COVID-inspired shared use streets — one of which was installed along 110 St. — where speed limits have been reduced to 20 km/h and space has been marked out for cyclists and pedestrians. Such a shared-use street treatment, they say, could be continued permanently along 110 St. at a significantly lower cost than installing and maintaining bike lanes separated by concrete medians and with heavy signage. Winter snow clearing could still be managed, while residents would have better access to their homes. Should a separated bike lane be necessary in the future it would still be possible to install it along the street. Embracing the shared-use street concept would foster a more connected neighbourhood, reduce neighbourhood redevelopment costs and address resident and visitor accessibility concerns. No response has been received from the City to this suggestion yet.

Development news

Development applications (Jun. 1 – Sept. 4)

Multi-unit housing proposed

A planning application has been recently made to rezone 11508-80 Avenue from Single Detached Residential Zone (RF1) to Small-Scale Infill Development Zone (RF3) to allow for the development of small scale multi-unit housing. Under RF3 zoning, up to four units could be built on the site. More information has been requested from Planning about this proposal.

Westrich project update

The Westrich project at 115 St. and University Ave. has been approved and a development permit to allow construction was issued at the end of July. Before then, however, community members engaged with the developer Richie Lam to push for some adaptations of landscaping and building finishes to make the project blend a little better with the community. Westrich agreed to several of these adaptations, including adding more stone to the front; using more evergreens in the landscaping along 115 St. to soften the edge of the property; improving visibility for vehicles entering/exiting the parkade at 115 St. to ensure safety for pedestrians and cyclists; and ensuring the University Avenue face of the building offers an inviting street presence.

Lam also agreed to support the Charles Simmonds Park renewal project, as the park will be a solid amenity for the residents of the new building. The form of this support is open, as the project is in early stages, but could include landscape design and support for fundraising activities.

Although this negotiation came at a very late stage in the development process, it did reinforce the value of community consultation for all parties.

Pinto project update (114 St.)

Neighbours of the proposed Pinto development for two multiunit four-storey apartment buildings (at 114 St. and 78 Ave.) have received an update on the project from consultant Kirsten Goa. Pinto Developments has engaged Marcelo Figueira with Green Space Alliance to work with the proposal to see if it can fit more closely to the Area Redevelopment Plan, and to engage the community along the way.

Goa reports that Figueira, who has extensive experience with community engagement, design planning and public space, plans to hold three community meetings/workshops to help inform a new proposal, one that will achieve the intentions of the ARP. One of the workshops will probably focus on the public realm (connectivity through the site, pocket park or plaza, including design elements), while another will likely be about the built form of the building(s) themselves and the third will look at both aspects together.

This new proposal will still require a DC2 rezoning because of the challenges (size, orientation) of this location, but is unlikely to include the microsuites that were part of the original proposal.

Goa points out that engaging Figueira is a positive sign, and could bring out a proposal that does a much better job of meeting the goals the community set out when the ARP was created — as well as giving everyone will have more of an opportunity to be involved in the process.

Veg in Yeg sprouts in McKernan

You may have noticed a garden plot bursting with plants that popped up this summer on a vacant lot on University Ave between 110 and 111 Streets. A neat sign boasts 'Fresh Veggies' and directions on how to order from Veg in Yeg (veginyeg.ca).

This plot is the newest location for an urban farming project that had its beginnings in Garneau in 2014. Now run by Nicole, a hard-working graduate student originally from Manchester, U.K., the garden offers a wide variety of fresh vegetables under a pay-what-you-can model — and shows bright ideas for bringing local food to communities.

The McKernan lot needed a lot of work, says Nicole, but it became available after the Garneau location was sold. She and a handful of other volunteers worked hard to pull weeds, shovel clean soil, install irrigation and mulch paths, not to mention starting 800 plants from seed in late winter ready to transplant come spring.

Now the lot is bursting with everything from kale to carrots to cucumbers, beets to brussel sprouts, supplemented with delicious greens and delicate herbs grown in an indoor tower garden at Grant MacEwan University.

Volunteers are people who know a bit about or want to learn more about gardening, although a few are mainly looking for a way to get out of the house and in touch with the natural world.

Response has been great, says Nicole, with more demand than the small lot can keep up with. She outlines many ideas for expansion, including using sunny front or back yards in other lots, and matching unused garden space across the community with volunteers who could plant and harvest.

Her plans for next few years including investing in the soil and site and adding a community compost area. One big item holding the project back, she says, is the lack of storage — she could really use a convenient shed or



garage to store tools and supplies, and more fridges, freezers or cold storage areas to keep the produce fresh for longer. More experienced garden mentors could also be helpful as she and her volunteers work out the best crops and techniques for growing in Edmonton.

She also dreams of setting the organization up as a non-profit so she could offer a wage for employees and expand to other sites to provide both more jobs and food for the community.
