110 St. bike lane through McKernan to be part of Garneau renewal

The city's bike network will be expanded in 2021 along 110 St. to connect the existing bike lanes on 76 Ave. north through the University and to the High Level Bridge. Installation of new bike lanes will affect residents of McKernan and Garneau.

Initial plans for neighbourhood renewal in Garneau, which is to start in 2021, were presented at an event in September, but McKernan residents along 110 St. may not have been aware that those plans also impact their street.

The design of the bike facility has not been finalized, according to Neighbourhood Renewal project staff, and there will be another event on Nov. 30 (see below) to look at options for the street. The design will impact on-street parking and possibly the direction of travel allowed. The league has asked the City to specifically invite property owners along 110 St. in McKernan to ensure they are aware of the process.

Following the November event, the draft design will be shared in spring and refined design in Fall 2020. Any residents or bike facility users who want to have input on the design are encouraged to take part in the consultations or to comment.

The drop-in open house will be on Saturday, November 30 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at St. Basil's Cultural Centre (10819-71 Avenue). Updates on the Garneau renewal, including bike lane options, can be found at edmonton.ca/BuildingGarneau; after the open house, residents will be able to comment online at that site until December 21.

Crime still an issue

Property crime continues to be a problem in the University area with multiple garage break and enters and thefts from vehicles reported in McKernan, Belgravia and Garneau. Stay vigilant about locking your property and reporting incidents and suspicious behaviour. You can also email belgraviawatch@gmail.com to join Belgravia's crime watch email list for periodic updates. Crime stats by community can be viewed at crimemapping.edmontonpolice.ca.

A special note about abandoned bikes — if you find an abandoned bike, pick it up and (if possible) take it to the Edmonton Police (Windemere Station). Criminals may drop off the bikes they use while they pick off newer bikes or cars.

EPS recovered almost a hundred bikes and bike parts in a recent arrest, but almost none have yet been returned. Make sure to photograph and record the serial number of your bike, and consider registering your bikes with Bike index (Bikeindex.org) and marking it with a Bike Index sticker from any bike shop or police station. Also report any bike theft as your bike may turn up later.

SafeCityYEG tool helps pinpoint trouble spots

Have you ever felt unsafe in the city? Now you can help identify spaces where you feel safe or unsafe, where you might look around twice before passing through, where you've experienced street harassment or any form of sexual violence.

Go to the SafeCityYEG tool (https://safecityedmonton.crowdspotmap.com/page/welcome) and add pins to the map to identify a safety concern (or places where you feel comfortable). This information will be used to help improve safety across the city.

Seniors looking for snow removal help?

Seniors in Edmonton can get referrals for reputable companies to shovel snow through the Edmonton Seniors Home Supports Program. While the program screens the companies, it is still up to the individual to contact the referred service providers; services are not free. The program also offers referrals for yard help, housekeeping. home repair and maintenance, personal services, and moving help. Someone in need? Call 211 to help

As winter tightens its grip, vulnerable people may find themselves in situations where they need more help, whether shelter, warm clothes or a meal. If you see someone in distress, you can help before emergency services are needed by calling 211 and press 3 for the 24/7 Crisis Diversion Team.

24/7 Crisis Diversion is a collaborative partnership of Edmonton that responds around the clock, seven days a week, 365 days a year. The teams provide crisis intervention services when someone is experiencing a medical or mental health (non-emergency) crisis; when there is a potential safety concern for the individual involved; or when someone is possibly intoxicated, or otherwise impaired.

The teams also connects individuals to the support they need in the immediate crisis.


