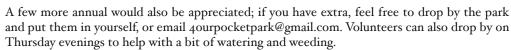

Social enterprise fund loan renewed

The loan that the league received from Edmonton's Social Enterprise Fund to construct the hall was renewed June 15 for a further five years at 5% interest. The league still owes \$167,007.64 on the loan (original amount \$250,000 in 2014), but has a plan to eliminate the balance by the end of the term through revenue and casino funding.

Thefts from garages and autos still an issue

Warmer weather seems to be bringing out criminals; thefts from garages and automobiles increased with 11 incidents reported last month. Tobacco/cannabis use in public spaces

The City of Edmonton's Public Places Bylaw regulates where smoking is permitted in public places: this includes tobacco, vaping and cannabis. Smoking is not permitted in parks that contain playgrounds (i.e., McKernan Park, McKernan School grounds, Gowan Park or Charles Simmonds Park), in spray pakrs or skate parks, on sportsfields or on off-leash areas. It is also not permitted inside any building, including bus shelters or LRT stations. Please safely dispose of litter!

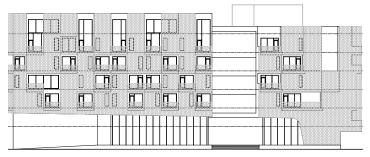

114 St. development seeks rezoning

On Monday, July 15 City Council is scheduled to hear the application to rezone the properties at the corner of 114 St. and University Ave. to allow the development of a six-storey residential building with limited commercial uses on the ground floor.

The building would replace the five houses at 11339 to 11361 University Ave. and 7915 114 St. The requested rezoning is to a Site Specific Development Control Provision (DC2), to allow the site to develop to different standards than the regular RA8 zoning that would normally accommodate a six-storey multifamily building. (DC2 rezoning is very common in Edmonton and allows the City greater control over how a site is developed.)

The proposal, which was presented to the community at an open house in April (see the April Messenger online), has raised a few flags in the community, including for its very small setbacks from all sides of the property, and for the number of units (up to 155). Many concerns were also raised at the open house about traffic; however, a traffic study commissioned by the developer suggests that "minimal transportation impacts are expected" and that the amount of vehicle and bicycle parking planned exceeds the requirements. It notes that the site is "located in a highly pedestrian and transit-oriented area. As a result, the vehicular trip generation by the development is likely significantly less than the typical trip generation rates, with travel modes such as walking, biking, and transit as popular alternatives." It estimates increased traffic from the alley to 114 St. to about 32 vehicles per hour at peak traffic times, with slightly more traffic at the 113 St. end of the alley.

Other points from the proposal:

- All parking would be underground except for three visitor spots.
- At-grade units along 114 St. and University Ave will have individual entrances including private amenity areas and landscaping.
- · Substantial bike parking would be provided for residents.
- The site would include a publicly accessible courtyard to the commercial space.
- The developer will pay to repave the lane and to upgrade the pedestrian sidewalk adjacent to the building along 114 St.

This site has already been identified in the McKernan-Belgravia Station Area Redevelopment Plan as appropriate for an RA8 zoning, which would allow for six storeys but with fewer units and larger setbacks, but which would also not require any extra features or amenities for the community such as those proposed by the developer in the DC2 application.

If the rezoning is approved, developers would still need to acquire a development permit for the actual construction, which requires further public consultation with league and its members.
