## League notes March

### Traffic safety improvements in front of school

After several months, signs have finally been installed at the McKernan School dropfoff to regulate parking. The signs were delayed after neighbourhood renewal, leaving the area open to long-term parking, adding to congestion and dangerous conditions during school drop-off and pick-up times. The new signs allow only five-minute (loading zone) parking from 7 am to 4 pm on school days but unlimited parking otherwise, which should also help to reduce parking congestion on evenings and weekends and offer spots for McKernan residents affected by the removal of parking on 76 Ave.

### Green Shack on site again this summer

Good news for neighbourhood kids: McKernan Park will be the site of a full five-day Green Shack program again this summer! Program will run July and August and feature supervised games, crafts and activities. It's a great way for kids to have fun and meet other kids from the community. Program is for kids ages 6-12 but younger kids may attend with a supervisor. Kids over 13 may also volunteer with the program as Leaders-in-Training. Watch for more details in the spring.

### Springtime parking pressures

As weather improves, the spring usually sees more people using McKernan as a free parking area. Most of McKernan is designated as a UA-2 parking zone, which means that non-residents may park for only 2 hours on weekdays between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. These streets are signed as such. If non-resident parking is an issue on your street within the UA-2 zone, you can report this by calling 311 or using the City of Edmonton's 311 app. Residents can get free permits to allow them to park without restriction.

## **Development news**

#### Lodging houses shut down

A new semi-detached house being run as two illegal lodging houses has been ordered to cease and desist operation,or acquire a legal permit, by March 15. The houses at 11233 and 11235—78 Ave seem to have opened immediately as lodging houses when construction was complete. Not only are the buildings not properly zoned, they also apparently fail several requirements for operating safely and legally as lodging houses. Owners have appealed to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB); this appeal is being opposed by the league.

#### Lodging house denial to be appealed

City Planning has turned down an application for a lodging house at 11520-78 Ave. because the site did not offer the required parking and loading space. The owner is appealing to the SDAB on March 14, on the grounds that the property is well-managed and that there are already several non-official lodging houses in the area. The league and several neighbours will be opposing the appeal and supporting Planning's decision.

#### Planning volunteers still needed

Our League would like to start a Planning Committee to provide input and concerns on submitted Development Applications and work with the Development Chair in developing replies to the Board and the City.

As can be seen above, lodging houses are an ongoing concern and we are developing a plan to address these systematically.
